INTRODUCTION

Anjuman Arts, Science and Commerce College is a religious minority educational institution managed by the Anjumane Islam, Dharwad. It came into existence in June 1986. It is a full fledged institution serving the cause of education. The college is affiliated to Karnatak University, Dharwad.

The College is situated in the heart of the city with all the facilities. It is our desire to develop the total personality of the young men and women with a spirit of education for service and also provide education an excellent academic quality for all without any discrimination.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Students seeking admission should apply for admission in the prescribed form available in the college office. They are advised to read carefully the prospectus before filling in the form.

Admission to any course is made for one academic year on the basis of merit and college admission norms. The admission is available to all on the first come first serve basis with the minimum eligibility as made required by the affiliated University.

Foreign students will be admitted to the college subject to regular student's VISA and eligibility certificate from the Karnatak University. They should furnish passport number, clearance from the Police, documents related to their date of birth and permanent or local address.

Students coming from the Universities outside the Karnataka State, shall have to produce Migration Certificate at the time of admission.

All admissions made by the college are provisional and subject to confirmation by the Karnatak University. If a student after being provisionally admitted is found ineligible his/her admission will be cancelled.

Principal of the college reserves the right of admission whose decision will be the final.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

B.A., B.Com I & II Semester

The student must have passed the second year PUC examination of the Karnataka PU Education Board, Bangalore or any other examination recognized as its equivalent by the Karnatak University.

B.A., B.Com III & IV Semester

The student must have kept two terms at B.A./B.Com I/ II semester course of Karnatak University or must have passed an equivalent examination.

B.A., B.Com V & VI Semester

The student must have kept two terms at BA/B.Com III/ IV semester course of Karnatak University or must have passed the equivalent examination..

CERTIFICATE AND DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

A student shall produce original/xerox copies of the statement of marks of lower examination issued by the PUE Board/Department of Vocational Education / Karnatak University.

Students are required to submit their Caste & income Certificate. Issued by Competent authority. In addition to this five xerox copies of each certificate must also be submitted.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION FOR SEMESTER COURSE

1. The University shall conduct an examination after the completion of every semester.
2. The composition of theory / practical and (I.A) for each paper shall be 80% and 20% of marks, respectively.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT (I.A) :

1. Each paper of 100 marks shall carry 20 marks (I.A.) Out of 20 marks, 10 shall be for semester tests and remaining 10 shall be for assignment/class records/skill developments.
2. In each paper two tests shall be conducted for the award of (I.A.) marks and each of one hour duration for a maximum of 20 marks reduced to 10 later. First test shall be conducted in 8th week and second test in 12th week of the respective semester. The average marks attained in the 2 tests of 10 marks shall be taken as final (I.A.) marks for the test component.
3. The award of (I.A) marks for assignment/records/skill development shall be based on the submission of the same by the candidates duly certified by the concerned teacher.
4. The internal assessment (I.A.) marks awarded to students shall be displayed on the notice board of the college within 2 weeks from the date of conduct of the test. The Principal shall display the particulars of (I.A) marks awarded to each student, one week prior to the commencement of the semester and examination.
5. The Principal shall preserve the (I.A) records of all the students and their answer scripts till the declaration of the semester examination results.
6. A consolidated (I.A) marks list in all the papers of particular semester duly signed by HOD/Staff incharge and Principal shall be submitted to the University examination section by the colleges, prior to the date of commencement of the semester examination. The Principal shall maintain a master register of (I.A.) marks of all the students in the papers. This master register shall be kept open for inspection by the University authorities, at any time.
7. There shall be no provision for improvement of (I.A.) marks.

LIBRARY

Library Rules :

1. Books from "The home lending section" will be issued to the students of the college once in a week.

3. Books will be issued only on presentation of the Identity Card & Borrower's Card.
4. The students are required to possess their identity card while entering into the Library.
5. A fine of Re. 1/-per day per volume will be charged for the books returned after the due date.

6. Students are supposed to return all the books at the time of collecting their Hall Tickets.

7. During the examination the library is kept open from 8 am to 6 pm.

College Union And Gymkhana :

Under the Red Cross Wing the free health check-up, blood test, Special lectures on health and Hygiene day celebrations / observations etc., are conducted on the college campus for the benefits of students.

Computer Labs :

There are two Computer Labs. One for the UG Courses and the another for newly commenced PG Course in commerce. The labs have latest Dual Core Systems with windows. The stand by generator will be installed to take care of the occasional power Shut down.

The Gymnasium :

There is a well-equipped Gymnasium on the college campus. The students along with their studies can build the best physique, under the guidance of well trained Gymnasium Coach.

Magazine :

The College releases Magazine annually to develop innovative thinking and creative writing by encouraging them to write article poetry on various topics among the students creative thankings etc. It also includes a brief report of all the activities conducted during the year. Each student is entitled to receive a copy of the Magazine.

National Service Scheme (N. S. S.)

There is an opportunity for 100 students to enroll in our college NSS unit, 30 seats are reserved for girls. The aim of this scheme is to develop the potential strength, wisdom, idealism and enthusiasm of the youth into constructive social welfare. The scheme imparts education through social service in creating awareness of unity and tolerance along with the leadership qualities among the students. The main motto is of N.S.S. is to develop social service leading to national cohesion Not 'I' but 'W' is the essence of this scheme. The Volunteers selected for N.S.S. must attend 30 parades.

They have to serve for minimum 2 years. 3% of Post-Graduate seats are reserved for those N.S.S. Volunteers who have completed two-year course.

General Rules of the College :

1. A certain number of classes or practical work may be held before and after the prescribed college working hours whenever necessary.
2. Students desiring to have the character certificate, passing certificate etc., should apply atleast 3 days in advance along with the prescribed fees.
3. All the payments such as scholarship, refund of caution money, library deposit will be made through cheques "only on the production of Identity Card and concerned receipts.
4. Students will have to forfeit caution money to the college in the following circumstances.
 - a. Students fails to claim within 6 months from the term last attended.
 - b. If a student discontinues the course without paying the Tuition fees and other fees.
5. Student desiring not to continue in the II term of the academic year should inform the college authorities in the first term only. Students failing to do so are liable to pay the II term fees also.

Rules of Discipline :

1. Students should be regular, punctual and attend all the periods according to the time table and the special classes arranged by the concerned lecturers In Uniform.
2. Students must not attend any other class except of their own.
3. Students must show due respect to the members of teaching and non-teaching staff. Any mis-behaviour will invite proper disciplinary action.
4. Students are forbidden to write or make any marks on the walls, desks or furniture.
5. Students are not allowed to loiter in the verandahs and corridors of the college.
6. No person shall be invited to address a college meeting or Association without the permission of the Principal.
7. Students of the college are not allowed to play in any out side team without prior permission of the Principal.
8. No tour & excursion, Picnic or pleasure trips are to be arranged without the permission of the Principal.
9. Students should maintain perfect silence in the class rooms and discipline at .the college functions.
10. Use of filthy language in the campus will be viewed seriously.
11. The Students violating rules of discipline are liable to pay heavy fine and shall lose concessions or may even cause themselves for the expulsion from the college.
12. The decision of the Principal is final in all these matters.

13. Every Student should carry college Identity Card in the College Premises.
14. Uniform is compulsory for every student.
15. Use of mobile on the college campus is strictly prohibited.

Anti Ragging :

Ragging is a crime, whether committed inside & outside the college. The punishment for ragging is serve including Expelment from the college.
